## Only?

My father was a bus-driver all his life, and a very good bus-driver he was too. He was proud of his work: proud of his popularity as a driver/courier on his summer tours to the Western Islands; proud that the kids on the School Run would confide their little secrets to him; proud that he could get his bus through winter storms; proud of his timekeeping; proud of his uniform. And I never *once* heard him say he was *only* a bus-driver.

He'd served in the RAF in North Africa during World War II, where he was a truck-driver with the Transport Division. He was never a pilot, and, indeed, never flew – apart from one occasion when he had to do a mandatory parachute-jump, which absolutely terrified him! But not once did I hear him say about his War service that he was *only* a truck-driver – and he had medals to prove that he'd served the same as everyone else.

How often the word “only” is used to describe people. *Only a housewife ...* drop the “only” and be thankful for good homemakers; *only a shop-assistant ...* implying someone who serves in a store has a menial job. Cut out the “only” and let's be proud of the service we all give.

During a TV report on the current pandemic, a BBC reporter was interviewing a domestic in a Covid Ward. As this man was mopping the corridor floor – and not stopping during the interview – he said, “I’m not a doctor or a nurse. They don’t do what I do. I don’t do what they do. But we all matter. We all have a part to play.” I shed tears when I heard that!

Praise God for people who are is proud of what they do. There was no “only a domestic” for this man, nor should there be. He’s a *good* domestic! I’m glad he’s reminded me of that. So, let’s drop the “only” and be proud to be homemakers, shop-assistants, domestics and bus-drivers. Let’s value *everyone* for what they do to benefit us all.
