If anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, hand over your coat as well. If anyone forces you to go one mile, go with them two miles.

Jesus' people were occupied by the Roman Army. A soldier could force you to carry his gear for one mile. You *had* to do it, or you were in trouble. But the soldier couldn't ask you to go further. So why not offer more, Jesus is saying. Take the soldier by surprise. Give more than you have to. Don't just do the minimum, what's expected. What a difference it will make!

I hope that's what that Doggie Cay Care company was offering. And you and me? J M Barrie gives us the meaning of Jesus' teaching: A new rule of life from tonight? Always try to be a little kinder than is necessary.
