## Legacy

For the *raison d'être* of these daily pieces is not, and will never be, to glean accolades, seek reward, or fix a particular time in the memory. I wish no legacy, save – with J K Rowling – to focus on the "now" in my care of the living, including every person who's reading this.

I "care about the living" too. So if, occasionally, something I write generates a thought, or creates a resonance, or offer reassurance as an aid to your day, that's legacy enough for me. If in the "now" of your living I've helped you a bit, so my heart is warmed some more, and that will grow if I know you can pass on what you've gained to those around you.
